New House Team Names

You may have noticed over the past 12 months we have slowly been changing our image at St Mary's. We have a new school uniform, new logos and new signage. So we decided it was time to change our House Team names to reflect the area that we live in. We have four teams in the colours green, red, yellow and blue. So we decided that our team names should incorporate the following -

- Catholic Identity
- Indigenous
- Local Landmark
- MegaFauna

After much research, discussion and evaluation, we have decided on the following names to lead our House Teams into the future. They are:

Catholic Identity - (Green)

'Josephites': 'The Joeys'

In 1919 the Sisters of St Joseph were brought to staff St Mary's School in Lancefield.

Indigenous - (Red)

'Wilimee Moorring': 'The Wilims'

Wilimee Moorring means 'axe place' representing the Mt William Stone Axe Quarry (a significant Aboriginal site) just outside of Lancefield.

Local Landmark - (Yellow)

'Farmers': 'The Agi's'

The Lancefield area was first settled by squatters c.1837 and developed into a potato farming district along with sheep, cattle, wheat and other cereal crops.

MegaFauna - (Blue)

'Diprotodon': 'The Wombats'

Extinct megafauna remains were found in the Lancefield Swamp. One of which was the Diprotodon, a rhinoceros-sized wombat.

New flags are in the process of being made to promote our new House Team names. We hope that we'll be able to celebrate these at an upcoming sports day before the year is out.
